Steve Craig 1954-2020

On Monday, 28th September the Club lost a friend in Steve Craig. He had been battling cancer for the last few years, but in the end it beat him. Yet he lasted long enough to see his beloved Liverpool become champions of England once again.

Steve had been involved with the Club since he was a young boy. He became the Club's Junior Champion three times in 1967, 1968 and 1970, and was the Club's Senior Champion in 1970 and 1971.

In the 1980's he brought his children Rosanna and Oliver to the Club in his capacity as a single parent.

He became the Club's Secretary in the 1990's when no one else wanted the job.

The Club has always had a Club Shop, but it was Steve who insisted, that the items for sale were visible to all the parents that attended the Club. He ensured that the Club newsletter was sold, even if he coerced one of the swimmers into being his shop assistant.

In 2008 he made a comeback to competitive swimming as he participated in several Masters events for a few years, until a neck injury put an end to that.

He attended town council meetings to help the Club achieve funding for various projects.

Whenever he attended the Club, he ensured that the swimmers started their warm-ups when teachers were late. He was always approachable and often had a quick answer to anything that was said. He was a friendly face that greeted most people at the pool.

He will be missed.
