Swimming Club Teacher Frankie Roberts acted as a runner between the timekeepers and the recorder, who was Saskia Daly. Club Chairman Philip Croxall was chief timekeeper and referee. The starter and organiser was Fiona Callaghan from Pendle Vale School.

There were teams from Blacko, Christ Church, Church, Coates Lane, Sacred Heart, St. Josephs and St. Michaels.

It was a competitive gala with no one team dominating, and plenty of encouragement from the spectators, and after all the races had been completed, there was a delay, as the results were verified and double checked. This was because there was a tie between two of the schools as they finished with 50 points each. To separate the teams a count-back system was used. But they were tied on 1st places, and 2nd places. It took a count of total 3rd place finishes to separate St, Michael, who won and runners up Church. The relay winners were Sacred Heart for the boys and St. Michael for the girls.
