Outdoor Adventure

On Saturday 8th July, we have organised a Club trip to Outdoor Elements, which is situated just outside Simonstone.

The day of fun activities will be from 9:30am until 4:00pm, with drinks provided. You will need to bring a packed lunch..

Throughout the course of the day, there will be five activities to take part in, each will have an instructor to show you what to do. You will be split into multiple groups, and we ask for at least one adult volunteer per group.

Friendly League

The team travelled down the M65 to the Hyndburn Sports Centre, Accrington to take on Accrington SC.

It was an even contest for the Backstroke, Breaststroke and Butterfly events, but when it got to the Freestyle events the Colne Swimmers pulled away from their hosts to record a 63 points to 54 victory. This was our first win since the league had to stop because of the pandemic.

There were 45 new personal bests for the Colne swimmers with 26 for the girls and 19 for the boys.

For our first home fixture of the season we were hosts to Burnley Bobcats.

Burnley started the gala strongly before Colne managed some wins, but the visitors were winning the close contests. This allowed them to stretch their lead throughout the contest to eventually win by 68 points to 47.

Despite the defeat the Colne swimmers managed a further 44 new personal bests between them with the girls recording 26 and the boys 18.

Our next fixture is against Great Harwood at the Accrington Academy on Monday, 19th June with a 7pm warmup. This is followed by our next home fixture on Thursday, 6th July against Accrington SC.

Schools Gala

The schools galas was held on Tuesday, 7th March with a further two "fun" galas on the 14th and 21st March.

Cherry Wilkinson Memorial Age Group Gala

On Thursday, 29th June we will be holding the **Cherry Wilkinson Memorial Age Group Gala for June**, which is open to all swimmers in the Club.

If you did all four events in the February Age Group gala, you will qualify for the Most Improved Swimmer, but only if you do all four events again.

In order to mirror the Friendly League, the 11 years and under will be doing 25 metres for each of the four strokes, whilst the 12's and over will be doing 50m. The 10 and 11 year olds can do 50 metres for all the strokes, but your 25m times are more important.

All swimmers 10 years and over can enter the 100m Individual Medley event at the end of the gala.
